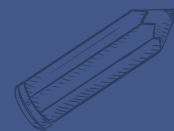
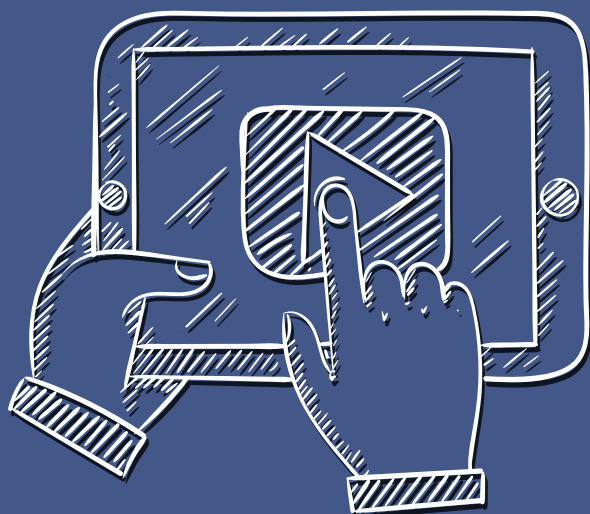

ROLE OF MASS MEDIA IN DIGITAL EDUCATION



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Digital education, also termed as Technology Enhanced Learning (TEL) or e-Learning, implies adoption of innovatively developed digital tools and technologies for education. With recent advancements in technological innovations, the global education system has also progressed. The impressions of fourth industrial revolution are significantly visible on learning pedagogies too. Education 4.0, as it is referred now, also focuses on the approach of education in line with the fourth industrial revolution.

With mass media being one of the largest accessible and reachable platforms for communication and knowledge sharing, its role in teaching and education cannot be ignored. There have been campuses where newspapers are being used to teach history, videos are used to teach natural sciences and audios are used for education of children with special needs. Mass media, that include television, radio, advertising, films, Internet, newspapers, magazines, etc. have tremendous role in learning process and

so, the employment of media content in present education system cannot be overlooked. The modern digital mass media also called 'new media' has enhanced educational proficiency of mass media manifold. The advancements in new media technologies have made convergence of multiple mass media platforms possible, and now varied multimedia content can be consulted through a single window. The engagement of digital media in education is evolving significantly with the introduction of interactive multimedia hardware and software, that are not only teacher-student friendly but also provide opportunities for enhancing digital competence, creativity and global learning.

The mass media plays a vital role when it comes to informing the public on the events of the past and what's new emerging in the areas of health, disasters, politics, sports, economy and international relations. Newspapers and magazines are also digitalised and available as e-papers and online editions. This 'digital print media' is much more current than textbooks. They provide ample infor-



mation that makes them an excellent resource for teaching and learning. These ‘digital resource boards’ not only expose apprentices to updated facts and figures, they also stimulate the creative skills of communication among the learners through the different forms of writing like profiles, narratives, travelogues, features, letters, advertisements and reports. Mass media like the newspapers and magazines are also effective teaching tools for language trainings and developing reading culture.

The Internet has bridged the student-teacher relationship gap through its interactive character. It has brought the resources for research available on a click, and enhanced visibility of good research and creative works. The availability, adaptability and convenience of social media provide an opportunity for instant communication between teachers and students, students and students, teachers and parents, and teachers and teachers. Everyone gets a chance to participate in the educational system, thereby, enhancing healthy competition, creativity and productivity.

The involvement of multiple social media platforms like Facebook, WhatsApp, Twitter, Instagram, LinkedIn, etc. in educational sphere cannot be ‘overlooked’. While on one hand, the social media provides easy and free or cost nominal access to

information, on the other hand it also promotes distance education platforms. The digital communication applications/platforms like Skype, Zoom, Google Meet, Google Classroom, etc. are now extensively used for teaching, presentations, conferences and meetings. These platforms not only bring schools to home but also offer an enormous space for interactions and information sharing. Innumerable websites and blogs also act as dynamic information sources.

Moreover, educational radio and television programmes can support millions of children in their journey of education who lack access to internet or have low digital literacy. The COVID-19 pandemic made the world realise the relevance of television and radio as educational media when 90% of the student population couldn't attend their educational institutions. Though many nations opted for online education, but according to a UNESCO study, 826 million students (50% of global student population) were kept out of classrooms by the pandemic as they didn't have access to a computer at home and 706 million (43%) had no internet at home. In those circumstances, television and radio provided an effective solution and proved to be a good alternative in those environments where online learning was not possible. These broadcasts were also used for inter-generational learning,

including learning of the local languages, as well as issues such as health and psycho-social well-being.

India was the pioneer in the use of television for education since 1969, when it entered into an agreement with US for support to SITE (Satellite Instructional Television Experiment) that was launched in 1975. The evaluation study of SITE revealed that about 50,000 rural teachers were exposed to a multi-media package for training in teaching of Science and Mathematics during SITE project. The Gyan Darshan channel, a collaborative project of two Indian ministries (Ministry of Education and Ministry of Information & Broadcasting) also emerged as an excellent platform for digital education. Likewise, the digital courses run by SWAYAM, and digital repository of educational content for graduate and post-graduate courses in the form of e-Pathshala (an MoE initiative) also provide high-quality and well-researched learning and training resources to the students.

The Radio too has been used as an educational medium in several countries including India, Sri Lanka, Thailand, South Korea, UK, Mali, Botswana, South Africa, Mexico, and many more. Various



government agencies at the level of conventional and distance universities are making use of radio for broadcasting their educational content as economic local supplementary alternative. In this context, the examples of Gyan-Vani (educational FM channel of India), IGNOU-AIR broadcasts in Mumbai, Hyderabad and Shillong, Language Learning Programme of Department of Education at AIR in Rajasthan and UNESCO's radio forum for adult education and community development are worth mentioning educational radio projects of India.

Also, using films for educational purpose plays a major role in improving memory performance and cognitive abilities. Though the selection of films for education purposes needs due care and caution, their engaging and entertaining character cannot be neglected. Many films are created with the sole purpose of education, and act as wonderful video tutorials to the audience and are intended to provide area-specific knowledge. Films have especially proved to be an effective tool of learning for children with special needs. Mass media is an excellent tool for educational instructional methodologies, which share immense responsibility of disseminating digital education in countries with large student populations with varied media accessibilities. ★

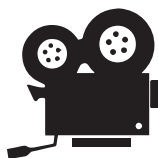
Excerpt from the Lecture

'Environment' simply means 'surroundings' (environs); hence the environment of an individual, object, element or system includes all of the other entities with which it is surrounded. The 'environment' of an individual, however, is not in isolation and thus, it may be regarded as a 'space' or a 'field' in which networks of relationships, interconnections and interactions between entities occur. Components of the environment include natural, humans and human made entities with a network of interconnections between them. To create awareness about human environment, in 1972, the United Nations General Assembly established the World Environment Day (WED) on the first day of the Stockholm Conference on the Human Environment. WED was first observed in 1974 in the city of Spokane in the USA. The theme of the first WED was "Only One Earth" and after almost five decades the theme still holds its stand and is also the theme of WED 2022. Led by United Nations Environment Program (UNEP), WED is the largest global platform for environmental outreach.
