

QUALITY MATTERS: ADDRESSING RESOURCE PERSON TRAINING IN SWAYAM MOOCs



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India's SWAYAM platform aims to improve access to higher education through MOOCs, aligning with national goals of equity, quality and inclusion. Backed by the Ministry of Education and UGC, it utilizes diverse digital teaching methods within a quality framework. The platform's effectiveness hinges on well-trained resource persons, including course coordinators and evaluators, who must adhere to "Quality Matters" (QM) standards. However, there has been insufficient focus on their systematic training, which is vital for effective digital pedagogy. This article emphasizes the need for professional development for these individuals, discusses challenges and proposes improvements by referencing global practices for sustainable quality enhancement in SWAYAM MOOCs.

The Role of Resource Persons in SWAYAM MOOCs

Resource persons are integral to SWAYAM, handling course objectives, material curation, assessment design and discussion moderation to foster learner engagement in digital environments. They must integrate traditional pedagogy with modern asynchronous learning, which requires expertise in

subject matter, instructional design and digital skills. Faculty from IITs, IIMs and central universities often lead these efforts, but many lack formal training in online pedagogy, leading to content and instructional disparities. As of 2024, SWAYAM has offered over 8,000 MOOCs with over 3 crore enrolments; however, course completion rates are below 10% due to insufficient training for course developers. MOOCs necessitate transforming content into multimedia formats and accommodating varied learning styles, thus emphasizing the need for comprehensive training for resource personnel to uphold the platform's credibility.

Current Training Mechanisms for SWAYAM Resource Persons

SWAYAM requires course developers to undergo basic orientation through workshops led by National Coordinators and academic centres, focusing on technical skills for lecture recording and content management. While organizations like NPTEL and CEC offer instructional design guidelines, current training primarily addresses procedural aspects rather than integrating online learning theories. Training consistency varies by institution, with some, like IGNOU and IIMBx,



providing extensive instruction on learner engagement and assessment. However, challenges such as limited funding, poor digital infrastructure and lack of unified accreditation hinder training scalability. Additionally, although SWAYAM encourages regular content updates, it does not enforce continuous professional development for content creators, creating a gap in pedagogical quality maintenance.

SWAYAM's training ecosystem is evolving in accordance with NEP 2020, emphasizing digital pedagogy, blended learning and faculty capacity building. National Coordinators from organizations like NPTEL and IGNOU are implementing structured faculty development programs that extend beyond basic technical training to cover inclusive education, learner-centric design and outcome-based assessments. The PM e-Vidya initiative, integrated with SWAYAM, requires training for resource persons in accessibility standards, promoting the usability of courses for learners with diverse needs, including disabilities. Additionally, there is a growing emphasis on standardized certification for resource persons, with discussions underway in UGC and AICTE suggesting that future SWAYAM training may require accreditation to ensure that course developers meet essential pedagogical and technical competencies, aiming to rectify inconsistencies across institutions and establish quality assurance benchmarks.

Challenges in Resource Person Training

The document outlines challenges in training resource persons for MOOCs, highlighting a conceptual gap between subject-matter expertise and digital pedagogy, which leads to traditional lecture formats dominating content creation. Responsibilities for training are fragmented among National

Coordinators, causing inconsistencies in course quality and learner satisfaction. Additionally, the lack of institutional incentives discourages faculty from investing in MOOC development, treating it as an unrecognized burden. The evaluation of training effectiveness is underdeveloped, with few mechanisms to assess its impact on learner outcomes. Cultural and language barriers further complicate the integration of online pedagogy in India's diverse educational landscape, risking the perpetuation of existing inequities unless targeted, inclusive practices are adopted.

Emerging studies on SWAYAM reveal systemic challenges in Indian MOOCs, particularly regarding the lack of exposure among resource persons to best practices in MOOC pedagogy such as adaptive learning analytics, gamification and peer-to-peer learning models. This gap in training hampers Indian MOOCs' ability to compete with international platforms like Coursera and edX, particularly in terms of learner engagement and retention. Another crucial issue is the absence of a formal recognition framework for faculty contributions to MOOCs. Despite the emphasis of NEP 2020 on digital teaching and blended learning, many universities have not incorporated MOOC development into their appraisal and promotion systems, which discourages faculty from investing effort in creating high-quality courses. Additionally, the swift evolution of technology, including AI-driven content delivery and immersive tools like AR/VR, necessitates ongoing skill enhancement for resource persons—a requirement that current training mechanisms fail to meet adequately.

Comparative Analysis: Practices from Other MOOC Platforms

An analysis of international MOOC platforms—edX, Coursera and FutureLearn—highlights effective practices in structured faculty training essential for course development. EdX uses its "Studio" authoring environment with guided templates aligned to the Quality Matters (QM) rubric, facilitating workshops with instructional designers. Coursera follows a scaffolded faculty development approach through its "Teaching and Learning Centres," emphasizing orientation and pedagogical mentoring, while its "Instructor Community" supports peer learning. FutureLearn enhances digital pedagogy with a dialogue-based model and its "Educator Guidance Framework." A critical feature across these platforms is the use of analytics-driven data for instructor improvement,

currently missing in SWAYAM's framework. This comparison indicates that successful MOOC platforms consider faculty training an ongoing, accredited professional development process, supported by mentorship. Adopting these strategies could help SWAYAM align with Quality Matters standards and adapt to the Indian higher education context.

Leading MOOC platforms emphasize continuous professional development (CPD) over one-time training. For example, Coursera mandates regular updates for instructors on digital pedagogy, while edX includes peer-review cycles for course quality assurance. FutureLearn integrates inclusivity and accessibility training into its framework. The use of learning analytics dashboards allows faculty to monitor student engagement and performance in real time, enabling dynamic content adaptation—a feature lacking in SWAYAM. Furthermore, international platforms offer formal accreditation and micro-credentials to enhance instructor motivation and teaching standards. Integrating these elements into SWAYAM could significantly improve its global credibility and competitiveness.

Recommendations for Enhancing Training Programs

To improve the training of SWAYAM resource persons and course quality, several strategic recommendations are provided. A National Training Framework is suggested, focusing on instructor training based on Quality Matters standards and defining competencies in course design and accessibility. Continuous Professional Development should be institutionalized, with certifications linked to performance metrics. Regional Centres of Excellence in universities are proposed



to promote localized digital pedagogy and research-based practices. Instructional Design Mentorship must be established to enhance collaboration between academic and digital experts. A Training Quality Rubric based on QM standards should also be created for regular audits. Utilizing analytics to refine courses, recognizing MOOC development as academic output and promoting Peer Learning Communities are vital for fostering accountability and a sustainable learning culture among resource persons.

Resource person training is essential for enhancing the quality of MOOCs on SWAYAM, which requires improved pedagogical readiness among contributors. Adopting the Quality Matters philosophy will promote reflective teaching methods, while a national, ongoing instructor training framework can elevate SWAYAM's reputation globally, transitioning it into a premier model for open digital education. This framework will support Continuous Professional Development (CPD), integrating certifications, peer reviews and data-driven feedback. By prioritising inclusivity and accessibility, SWAYAM can better serve India's diverse cultural landscape and meet international standards. The success of similar platforms like edX and Coursera, characterised by mentorship and accredited pedagogy, reinforces the need for SWAYAM to implement equivalent strategies tailored to Indian higher education. Ultimately, investing in accredited resource person training is strategically vital for SWAYAM to evolve into a learner-centric ecosystem, producing high-quality, engaging and inclusive MOOCs that align with NEP 2020 and global standards, establishing itself as a flagship digital education initiative.

ईएमआरसी श्रीनगर: मूक्स समन्वयक, निर्माण टीम का उन्मुखीकरण कार्यक्रम आयोजित

ईएमआरसी श्रीनगर द्वारा मूक्स पाठ्यक्रम समन्वयकों (सीसी) एवं केंद्र की निर्माण टीम के लिए एक बैठक-सह-उन्मुखीकरण कार्यक्रम का आयोजन किया गया, जिसका उद्देश्य मूक्स विकास प्रक्रिया सुदृढ़ीकरण तथा आपसी समन्वय को सुव्यवस्थित करना है। इस कार्यक्रम में शैक्षणिक, तकनीकी एवं प्रशासनिक मुद्दों पर विचार-विमर्श तथा स्वयं, राष्ट्रीय शिक्षा नीति-2020 एवं अद्यतन सीईसी दिशा-निर्देशों के अनुरूप मूक्स पाठ्यक्रम के शुरु एवं पुनःप्रयोज्य से संबंधित प्रक्रियाओं के समन्वयन पर विशेष बल दिया गया।

कार्यक्रम के दौरान डॉ. सलीमा जान, निदेशक, ईएमआरसी श्रीनगर ने पाठ्यक्रम समन्वयकों से अधिक प्रतिबद्धता, समयबद्ध संचार एवं सक्रिय सहभागिता की आवश्यकता पर बल दिया। उन्होंने पूर्व के सत्रों में पाठ्यक्रम पंजीकरण के संबंधी कुछ समन्वयकों द्वारा समय पर प्रत्युत्तर न मिलने के उदाहरणों का भी उल्लेख किया। बैठक में जम्मू-कश्मीर के संबद्ध महाविद्यालयों एवं विश्वविद्यालयों तक व्यापक पहुंच के माध्यम से नामांकन को बढ़ाने की रणनीतियों पर चर्चा की गई। इसके साथ ही शैक्षणिक एवं तकनीकी मानकों के पालन पर विशेष जोर दिया गया, जिसमें आकलनों की संरचित निगरानी, शिक्षार्थियों की जिज्ञासाओं का समयबद्ध समाधान, निर्धारित समय-सीमाओं का अनुपालन तथा न्यूनतम चार से पांच लाइव सत्रों का आयोजन शामिल है।

बैठक में नवीन एवं पुनःप्रयोज्य पाठ्यक्रमों के बीच के प्रमुख अंतर को स्पष्ट तथा गुणवत्ता, निष्पक्षता एवं संवेदनशीलता सुनिश्चित करने हेतु सामग्री के समुचित परीक्षण के महत्व को रेखांकित किया गया। इसके अतिरिक्त सभी शिक्षार्थियों की जिज्ञासाओं का आधिकारिक सहायता डेस्क के माध्यम से निस्तारण करने तथा स्नातक, स्नातकोत्तर प्रासंगिकता वाले पाठ्यक्रमों के संबंध में सीईसी से विस्तृत निर्देश प्राप्त करने की आवश्यकता पर भी चर्चा की गई। कार्यक्रम का समापन मूक्स पाठ्यक्रम विकास की गुणवत्ता एवं दक्षता में वृद्धि हेतु ठोस अनुशंसाओं के साथ हुआ, जिसमें प्रतिभागियों ने उच्च शैक्षणिक एवं निर्माण मानकों को बनाए रखने के प्रति पुनः अपनी प्रतिबद्धता व्यक्त की।

EMRC Srinagar Holds Orientation for MOOC Coordinators and Production Team

EMRC Srinagar organised a meeting-cum-orientation programme for MOOC Course Coordinators (CCs) and the Centre's production team to strengthen the MOOC development process and streamline coordination. The programme focused on addressing academic, technical, and administrative issues while ensuring alignment with SWAYAM, NEP 2020, and updated CEC guidelines, particularly in relation to the launch and rerun of MOOCs.

During the interaction, Director EMRC Srinagar, Dr Salima Jan, emphasised the need for greater commitment, timely communication, and proactive engagement from CCs, noting instances of non-responsiveness after course sign-up in previous cycles. The meeting discussed strategies to increase enrolment through wider outreach to affiliated colleges and universities across J&K. Emphasis was also placed on maintaining academic and technical standards, including structured monitoring of assessments, timely resolution of learner queries, adherence to prescribed timelines, and conducting a minimum of four to five live sessions.

Key distinctions between fresh and rerun courses were reiterated, along with the importance of thorough content vetting to ensure quality, neutrality, and sensitivity. Additional discussions highlighted the need to route all learner queries through the official helpdesk and to seek clarification from CEC on courses with dual UG-PG relevance. The programme concluded with actionable recommendations to enhance the quality and efficiency of MOOC development, with participants reaffirming their commitment to maintaining high academic and production standards.

उद्घाटन समारोह में डॉ. पी. रवींद्रन, कुलपति, कालीकट विश्वविद्यालय, डॉ. मोहन कुन्नुम्मल, कुलपति, केरल विश्वविद्यालय, डॉ. देविका पी. मदल्ली, निदेशक, इनफिल्बनेट तथा श्री भक्तियार दादामौय उपस्थित रहे। इन पाठ्यक्रमों के लिए स्वयं पोर्टल पर पंजीकरण प्रारंभ हो चुका है। प्रत्येक पाठ्यक्रम में दो से लेकर चार क्रेडिट निर्धारित हैं, तथा इनकी शुरुआत जनवरी, 2026 के प्रथम पखवाड़े में की जाएगी।


Overview of the series

In this context, the roles of internal marketing, external marketing, and interactive marketing were discussed, highlighting how employee motivation, effective communication, and service delivery collectively ensure the fulfilment of service promises and long-term customer satisfaction.




