RESEARCH ETHICS: UNDERSTANDING AUTHORSHIP

uthorship is one of the most fulfilling experiences researcher. A culminating responsibility of an author is to communicate one's research work primarily, in the form of an article. A research article normally contains hypotheses, objectives, methodology, tools, data, findings, etc.; and identifies the person(s) who is responsible for the outcome, called the author. This attribution of authors of the research outcome is called authorship. Authorship is one grey and murky area in the research practice that requires an objective outlook by each researcher. Dereliction or malpractice of authorship by researchers has become rampant in this age of networking and collaboration. In this write-up, an overview and the importance of authorship are highlighted.

The Complexity and Dilemma of Authorship

As long as writing a scientific paper is a solo endeavour, there is no confusion about who the author is. The issue arises in multi-authored papers. With the increase in the number of authors, it becomes more difficult to identify the role and responsibility or the contribution of each author. The problem amplifies if we try to quantify the role or contribution of each author. This is observed particularly in collaborative research especially, in science, where there are hundreds or thousands of authors. The complexity increases when authorship is identified by the name of laboratories. In author-

ship cases like that it is difficult to pinpoint the role or contribution of each single individual. Some classic examples are that of CERN, Human Genome Project, etc. where several labs across different countries and thousands of scientists, engineers, technicians, researchers, etc., are involved.

Role and Contribution of Authors

It is important to identify the responsibilities and contributions to attribute a researcher as an author. CRediT (Contributor Roles Taxonomy) has identified 14 facets that can be used to represent the roles typically played by contributors to research outputs. There is, however, a caveat here. Playing any or some of the roles does not automatically qualify someone to become an author. It is upon the discretion of the leader along with other significant members of the research team to decide whether one qualifies for authorship.

- **Conceptualization:** Ideas; formulation or evolution of overarching research goals and aims.
- Data curation: Management activities to annotate (produce metadata), scrub data and maintain research data (including software code, where it is necessary for interpreting the data itself) for initial use and later re-use.
- Formal Analysis: Techniques to analyse or synthesize study data.
- **Funding acquisition:** Acquisition of the financial support for the project leading to this publication.

- Investigation: Conducting a research and investigation process, specifically performing the experiments, or data/evidence collection.
- Methodology: Development or design of methodology; creation of models.
- Project administration: Management and coordination responsibility for the research activity planning and execution.
- Resources: Provision of study materials, reagents, materials, patients, laboratory samples, animals, instrumentation, computing resources, or other analysis tools.
- **Software:** Programming, software development; designing computer programs; implementation of the computer code and supporting algorithms; testing of existing code components.
- Supervision: Oversight and leadership responsibility for the research activity planning and execution, including mentorship external to the core team.
- Validation: Verification, whether as a part of the activity or separate, of the overall replication/reproducibility of results/experiments and other research outputs.
- **Visualization:** Preparation, creation and/or presentation of the published work, specifically visualization/data presentation.
- Writing-original draft: Preparation, creation and/or presentation of the published work, specifically writing the initial draft (including substantive translation).
- Writing-review & editing: Preparation, creation and/or presentation of the published work by those from the original research group, specifically critical review, commentary or revision – including pre- or post-publication stages.

Who is not an author?

- Funder: Person or organization or any patron who provides financial support for research but without contribution to research other than funds.
- Reviewer and Commentator: Here reviewer or commenter would mean any person giving an opinion or passing a casual remark on the work or paper. It should be underscored that these reviewers or commentators are non-associated with the work.
- **Technical Assistant:** This category includes

- assistants who help in overall routine work in the laboratory or field.
- Intern and Apprentice: This includes tutelages that are being trained.
- Assistant: Any secretarial and account assistants who do the typing work, maintain files, and keep financial transactions related to the research project.

Malpractices of Authorship

There are two scenarios of authorship malpractices. The first one is when a person did everything an author would do but his or her name is not the authorship attribution. The second one is that a person did nothing or very little, at most, but his name is added to the authorship attribution. The former is called Ghost author and the later Honorary or Gift author. Within these authorship malpractices, there are several facades.

- Ghost authorship: Ghost authorship would mean the real author is unknown. There are primarily two types of ghost authorship. In the first type, a person did everything deserving authorship attribution but has been intentionally ignored or suppressed. This practice is commonly meted out to junior colleagues and PhD or post-doc scholars. The second type of ghost authorship is paid authorship, wherein a person is paid to write on one's behalf.
- Honorary or gift authorship: Also known as guest authorship, this kind of authorship is based upon a superficial and flimsy association with the work. It is often associated with seniors in the profession or experts in the field just to give a picture of authority and gloss during publication. Authorship may sound very simple to understand but practical usage in scientific writing has many denotations.

Attribution of authorship has many implications especially, in the evaluation of research and reward. It is used as a political tool to determine the productivity of a researcher, collaboration and networking among professionals, mapping cross-disciplinary research by affiliations of the authors, etc.

Whilst there will always be people who exploit and misuse authorship attribution for selfish gains, it calls upon every researcher to educate oneself on the importance of authorship. The misuse and abuse of attribution of authorship has unintended or unforeseen consequences, especially bringing disgrace to one's credentials and dignity.

DIGITAL EDUCATION; TOWARDS FUTURE PLANNING, SCOPE AND CHALLENGES

n recent years, India has marked rapid progress in digital education. The adoption of digital resources

by schools, universities and colleges is on the rise. Internet penetration and students' demand for digital resources have also increased after COVID-19. To cater to this demand, the government is investing in the development of infrastructure as a prime project. According to the IMF's working paper 'Stacking up the Benefits Lessons from India's Digital Journey', India has developed a world-class digital public infrastructure (DPI) to support its sustainable development goals with its journey seeking direction from other countries that are also in the field of digitalization of education. Digital education has been significantly propelled by the government's focus on strengthening digital infrastructure in the country, which includes providing internet connectivity to remote areas, as it was the main hurdle during COVID-19 for making education available to all.

According to the IAMAI-Kantar ICUBE 2020 report, active internet users in India are estimated to reach 900 million by 2025, a 45% increase from over 622 million active internet users in 2020. Also, internet penetration in the country is expected to reach 55% by 2025.

The Government of India also launched the 'Digital India' initiative in July 2015, to strengthen online infrastructure and expand internet access among citizens (for example, connecting rural areas to high-speed internet networks). As part of the 'Digital India' initiative, the government also launched the e-education initiative to provide online education in remote and urban areas using smartphones, apps and internet services.

Also, amid the pandemic, the Government of India took several initiatives (e.g., PM eVIDYA program, Diksha, etc.) to ease regulations and provide best practices in global online education as well as expand online access to universities and colleges.

Various channels have been defined by the Government of India for comprehensive sources and mediums to provide education in different corners of the country (e.g. Vyas, Vidhik, Vageesh, Saraswat etc.).

Ministry of Education (MoE) - Initiatives for Digital Education

A comprehensive initiative called PM eVidya was announced on May 17, 2020, which aims to integrate all efforts related to digital/online/on-air education to enable equitable multi-mode access to education. It is envisaged that this will benefit around 25 crore schoolchildren across the country. One of the most important initiatives of the Ministry of Education is DIKSHA (Digital Infrastructure for Knowledge Sharing). Previous initiatives like SWAYAM: Massive Open Online Courses, SWAYAM Prabha: Digital courses on TV, National digital library, e-PG Pathshala, e-Yantra, National Internship Portal, Virtual Labs, VIDWAN are contributing tremendously in the field of digital education.

DIKSHA (Digital Infrastructure for Knowledge Sharing): E-learning

As part of the PM eVidya announced under the Atmanirbhar Bharat programme, Diksha is 'One Nation'; One digital platform for school education in India. It was launched in 2017 as a national platform available to all state schools for grades 1 through 12. DIKSHA initiative can be accessed through a mobile application and web portal.

Future Planning for Digital Education in India: The futuristic approach of digital India is focused on fulfilling the following objectives.

- To develop quality e-content in local languages to address the diversity of Indian languages. The addition of skill development courses, virtual labs, and virtual vocational training should be established.
- To address the guidelines for the formulation of online/digital education to eradicate the digital divide.
- Developing digital classrooms by integrating education systems and technology.
- To develop a framework for assessment in the era of digital education.
- Ensuring consistent user experience by multi-mode access to education through mobile

- apps, web portals, TV channels, radio, and podcasts.
- To enable and enhance "anytime, anywhere" access, the focus will be on increasing the use of mobile phones.
- Providing full access to e-content and e-infrastructure anytime, anywhere is a priority for all learners in schools. However, the e-content is being developed with slightly varied priorities – classes 12 to 9, covering 6.3 crore children will be the topmost priority. Next on the table of priority would be graded 8 to 6 which would cover the student population of 64 million children. For Grades 5 through 1, the priority will be on arithmetic and foundational literacy.
- Teachers will be made skilled to take advantage of e-learning resources through various training programs.

Benefits/ Scope of Digital Education in India

During 2019-20 when India and the whole world were fighting the COVID-19 pandemic, digital education in India was the only source of learning for the students in the country. Some of the other benefits of digital education in India are discussed below:

This initiative has not only helped the students to gain theoretical knowledge but also practical and technical knowledge. There is no limitation regarding the place of learning or study. With digital learning, a student can join online classes at any time or learn from anywhere. With study material available online, students can take their own time to understand any topic. Through digital education, learning can be made more engaging and interactive between students and teachers.

India has significant scope for digital education due to its large population, increasing internet penetration, and growing demand for quality education. Here are some factors that contribute to the scope of digital education in India:

- India has a population of over 1.3 billion people, including a large number of young individuals.
 Digital education has the potential to reach a vast number of students across the country, including those in remote and underserved areas.
- India has witnessed a rapid increase in internet penetration, thanks to affordable smartphones and low-cost data plans. This widespread avail-

ability of the Internet has opened up opportunities for digital education, enabling students to access learning resources and online courses.

- The Indian government has launched several initiatives to promote digital education. Programs like Digital India and the National Digital Literacy Mission aim to enhance digital literacy among citizens and provide access to online education. Additionally, initiatives like SWAYAM (Study Webs of Active-Learning for Young Aspiring Minds) and e-Pathshala offer online courses and digital textbooks for students.
- Numerous e-learning platforms have emerged in India, offering a variety of courses and educational resources. Platforms like Byju's, Unacademy, Vedantu, and Khan Academy have gained popularity and cater to different age groups and educational levels. These platforms provide quality content, interactive learning experiences, and personalized learning paths.
- Digital education plays a crucial role in upskilling and re-skilling the workforce. As the demand for new skills increases due to technological advancements, online learning platforms offer flexibility and accessibility for individuals to acquire knowledge and enhance their employability.
- Digital education provides flexibility in terms of timing and location. Students can access learning materials and attend classes at their own pace and convenience, which is particularly beneficial for working professionals, students prepar-

- ing for competitive exams, and individuals in remote areas with limited access to traditional educational institutions.
- Online courses often offer more cost-effective alternatives to traditional classroom-based education. Digital education eliminates the need for commuting, reduces infrastructure costs, and allows for scalability, making quality education more accessible and affordable.
- Digital education platforms leverage technology to provide personalized learning experiences. Adaptive learning algorithms, data analytics, and artificial intelligence enable the customization of content based on individual learning needs, improving learning outcomes and engagement.

Challenges with Digital Education in India

The government will face a lot of technology adaptation issues to ensure that digital education is accessible to students across the country. The availability of an internet connection for all is one of the biggest requirements for digital education. For easy access to information, the government has to achieve this. During COVID the news related to the lack of internet connectivity in remote areas raised this demand.

Providing equipment and technology to people belonging to socio-economically weaker sections so that they can access digital resources for education is a challenge.

Training the teachers is another challenge. When teachers are technically enabled then only they can conduct digital classes.

Making digital education cost-effective should be the prime objective of the government. Ensuring that proper facilities are made available for digital classes in government schools and colleges. isperhaps the biggest challenge of them all.

In the Indian context, digital education has immense potential, however challenges such as reliable internet connectivity in rural areas, access to devices, and ensuring quality education for all must be addressed. However, with the right infrastructure development, policy support, and collaborative efforts from various stakeholders, the scope for digital education in India can move in a positive direction to achieve the Sustainable Development Goal of Quality Education in 2030.

Excerpt from the Lecture

In this lecture series, our objective is to delve into the rich tradition of Indian philosophy, specifically focusing on the Nyāya philosophical school. The term "Nyāya" itself conveys a significant aspect of this system, as it translates to "argumentation." This emphasizes that Nyāya philosophy is inherently analytical, logical, and deeply rooted in epistemology. Nyāya is often referred to as the science of reasoning or the science of logic and epistemology. Throughout this series, our primary focus will be on Nyāya epistemology, where we will explore the nature of knowledge and the means to attain it. It will further discuss the four accepted means of gaining valid knowledge according to the Nyāyikas: perception, inference, comparison, and testimony. These pillars of Nyāya philosophy form the foundation upon which the quest for truth and understanding is built.

Learning Objectives

- To acquire a thorough understanding of Nyāya philosophy including its fundamental principles and key concepts.
- To understand Nyāya epistemology, explore the nature of knowledge and the four means accepted in Nyāya Philosophy

 perception, inference, comparison, and testimony.
- To develop an in-depth understanding of the Nyāya philosophical framework and how these means help in acquiring valid knowledge within.

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


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
