

## **Glossary**

***Order*** - An "order" in Greek and Roman architecture consists of the column or support, including base and capital, and the entablature, or part supported.

***The Hellenic Period-*** Contains all the principal temples and monuments which were erected between the years B.C. 700 and the Roman occupation B.C. 146.

***The Doric Order-*** The Doric order, the oldest, plainest, and most sturdy Greek order, is traced to an Egyptian prototype.

***Triglyph-*** A triglyph is a unit consisting of three vertical bands which are separated by grooves.

***Metopes-*** Metopes are the plain or carved reliefs between two triglyphs.
