

GLOSSARY

FLUE—A duct for smoke and waste gases produced by the fire inside the fuel-burning kiln. Flue are also used to sometimes load the bricks into the kiln.

CHIMNEY—A vertical channel or pipe which conducts smoke and combustion gases up from a fire or furnace and typically through the roof of a building.

TRENCH - A long, narrow ditch.

STACK - Any structure or part thereof which contains a flue or flues for the discharge of gases.

KILN - A furnace or oven for burning, baking, or drying something, especially one for firing or baking bricks.
