Glossary

Pendantive: Curved triangle of vaulting formed by the intersection of a dome with its supporting arches.

Narthex: An antechamber, porch, or distinct area at the western entrance of some early Christian churches, separated off by a railing; an antechamber or large porch in a modern church.

Buttress: A structure of stone or brick built against a wall to strengthen or support it.

Altar: A table like structure for the celebration of the Sacraments in a Christian building; for sacrifice or offerings in antiquity.

Aisle: A passage or corridor parallel to the nave of a church or an ancient basilica and separated from it by columns or piers.
