## Glossary

Pig iron - According to tradition at the International Pig Iron Secretariat the name comes from the combination of using agricultural labourers in the first iron plants that then "saw" pigs suckling in the Shapes of the launder, runners and pools where the lumps of iron or "piglets" were formed.

**Cast iron** - Cast iron is a term typically associated with the most common gray iron. While cast iron may sound like the cast form of the pure element iron it's actually **an alloy containing 2–4 percent carbon**, plus additional amounts of silicon and manganese.

**Wrought iron** - **Wrought iron** is an iron alloy with very **low carbon** (less than 0.08%) content in contrast to cast iron (2.1% to 4%). It is a **semi-fused mass of iron with fibrous slag inclusions** (up to 2% by weight) which gives it a "grain" resembling wood that is visible when it is etched or bent to the point of failure.
