Glossary

Neoclassicism

It is the name given to Western movements in the decorative and visual arts, literature, theatre, music, and architecture that draw inspiration from the "classical" art and culture of Ancient Greece or Ancient Rome.

Infrastructure

The basic physical and organizational structures and facilities (e.g. buildings, roads, power supplies) needed for the operation of a society or enterprise.

Avenue

A broad road in a town or city, typically having trees at regular intervals along its sides.

Urban Renewal

Urban renewal, which is generally called **urban** regeneration ("regeneration" in the United Kingdom), "revitalization" in the United States, is a program of land redevelopment in areas of moderate to high density **urban** land use. **Renewal** has had both successes and failures.

District

An area of a country or city, especially one characterized by a particular feature or activity.
