

Glossary

Baradari: An Open-sided pavilion in a Mughal garden.

Chadar: Sloped surface with interesting patterns for water to flow in. Chadar or shawl-called so because the water flowing over the fine carving of marble resembles a finely woven kashmiri shawl.

Chabutra: A raised square stone dais in the center of the cross-axis of a Char Bagh designed to serve as a platform that accommodates one or two people who could enjoy from this central position the garden's water-cooled breezes and surrounding scenery.

Chini-kanas: Illuminated niches. Series of small recesses cut in the face of a terrace retaining wall to hold small oil lamps and flower.
