



Frequently Ask Questions

- 1) What are the two broad categories of employment for physical education graduates?
Ans. Physical education graduates or professionals are mostly offered employment opportunities in school setting and non-school setting.
- 2) What is the unique character of school children from 4 to 6 years?
Ans. Children at this age are typically motivated, eager and enthusiastic, and take pride in their progress.
- 3) Why primary school age group is important from the perspective of physical education?
Ans. Primary school age group is important from the perspective of physical education because this is the time when solid foundation of movement experience can be provided as base for their future physical development.
- 4) What should include in junior school physical education curriculum?
Ans. The junior school physical education curriculum should include dance, gymnastics, individual activities, aquatics, team sports etc.
- 5) What should be the focus for high school student in sports?
Ans. During the high school years students must begin to specialize in certain sport activities and pursue these interests.
- 6) What are the basic qualifications for teaching in professional preparation programs?
Ans. The qualifications for teaching in professional preparation programs at college and university levels may include advanced degrees and acceptable academic record.
