- 1) What is the most common method of evaluating physical education teacher in schools?  
**Ans.** Observation of teachers in the classroom or in the field/gymnasium.
- 2) What do you mean by accountability in teacher evaluation process?  
**Ans.** Accountability as an evaluation process may be simply defined as a means of holding the teacher (and other staffs) responsible for what the students learn.
- 3) Why it is important to involve student in the evaluation of physical educator?  
**Ans.** Because, student is the one of the most exposed person to the teacher and his or her methodology.
- 4) What is self-evaluation?  
**Ans.** It means to look within oneself, for the sake of improvement oneself.
- 5) How will you define independent evaluator?
