## **GLOSSARY:**

**Camping:** An increasingly popular outdoor recreation activity among children, youth and even adults, camping involves staying away from home in a shelter such as a tent, a caravan or a motorhome. For an activity to be considered as camping one has to spend at least one night in the camping area.

**Community Recreation:** Recreation activities or programs comprises the entire range of activities, relationships, interactions and experiences planned for and carried out to meet the recreation needs of the residents of the community which also includes providing the spaces and places where recreation takes place.

**Curriculum:** In totality curriculum comprises all the experiences that occur in the educational process. It comprises all the courses being offered by a school, colleges or universities.

**Enculturation:** Enculturation is the process by which people learn the requirement of their surrounding culture and acquire the values and behaviours appropriate or necessary in that culture and in the process the influences that limit, direct or shape the individual deliberately or not are the parents, other adults and peers.

**Family:** The smallest units of the social institution which consist of one or two parent/s and their children living together as a unit, these units are related to each other either by blood, marriage or adoption and have a shared commitment to the mutual relationship.

**Neighbourhood:** The area of a town, a district or community within a town or a city that surrounds our home, or the people who live or share the same geographical location in our vicinity.

**Religious Recreation:** The recreation or constructive use of leisure time through various religious institutions like the church, temple, mosque, gurudwara, etc. these programs are offered by the authorities of the religious institutions and can be of varied nature.

**Social Institution:** A system of behavioral and relationship patterns that are densely interwoven and enduring, and function across an entire society. They order and structure the behavior of individuals by means of their normative character.

**Socialization:** Adapting behaviour to the norms of a culture or society, going out and meeting people or hanging out with friends is socialization.

**Supernatural Realm:** Supernatural is related to being above or beyond what is natural, unexplainable by natural law or phenomena or abnormal. It is also referred to as characteristics or attributed to god or a diety.
