Glossary

- i) **Programmed Instruction**: Programme is a method of presenting new subject matters to students in a graded sequence of controlled steps.
- ii) **Reinforcement**: It is a stimulus, the presentation or removal of which increases the probability of a response being repeated.
- iii) **Linear Programme**: A linear programme is called a straight line programme as the learner starts from his initial behaviour to the terminal behaviour following a straight line.
- iv) **Virtual Learning**: A virtual learning refers to a set of teaching and learning tools designed to enhance a student's learning experience by including computers and the internet in the learning process.
- v) **Individualised Instruction**: Individualised instruction is a method of teaching in which content, instruction and pace of learning are based upon the abilities and interests of each learner
- vi) **Remediation**: The act or process of remedying or correcting something that is undesirable or deficient.
