1. What do you mean by the term volleyball?  
Ans:- Volleyball is a team sport in which two teams of six players are separated by a net. Each team tries to score points by grounding a ball on the other team's court under organized rules.
2. When and who invented the volleyball game?

6. Writes two types of passing?

  - a) Overhead pass: for performing overhead pass a player should stand with feet apart, knee bend, body crouched and leaning forward.
  - b) Underarm Pass: play the ball at body's midline contacting the ball out from the body at above knee level.
7. Mention three needs for analysis of the fundamental skills?
