Glossary

lycopene: Lycopene from the <u>neo-Latin</u> lycopersicum, the tomato species, is a red carotene and carotenoid pigment bright andphytochemical found in tomatoes and other red fruits and vegetables, such as red carrots, watermelons, gac, although and papayas, not in strawberries, or cherries

carcinogenic: A carcinogen is any substance, <u>radionuclide</u>, or <u>radiation</u> that is an agent directly involved in causing <u>cancer</u>. This may be due to the ability to damage the <u>genome</u> or to the disruption of cellular <u>metabolic</u> processes.

folate: Folic acid, also known as folate, is one of the <u>B vitamins</u>

prostate cancer: Prostate cancer, also known as carcinoma of the prostate, is the development of <u>cancer</u> in the <u>prostate</u>, a gland in the <u>male reproductive</u> <u>system</u>
