

Glossary

- **A cash crop** : A cash crop is an agriculture crop which is grown for sale to return a profit.
- **Cotton**: **Cotton** is a soft, fluffy staple fiber that grows in a boll, or protective case, around the seeds of **cotton** plants of the genus *Gossypium* in the family of Malvaceae.
- **Piperine** . Pepper gets its spicy heat mostly from piperine derived both from the outer fruit and the seed. Black pepper contains between 4.6% and 9.7% piperine.
- **Natural rubber**: Natural rubber is a latex material, originally from the Para rubber tree. The latex then is refined into rubber ready for commercial processing. Natural rubber is used extensively in many applications and products, either alone or in combination with other materials .
- **Synthetic rubber**: Synthetic **rubber** general term for many types of man-made rubbers
- **Latex**: emulsions from various plants, and the major raw material in the production of natural rubber,
- **Elastomers**: or elastic (rubbery) polymers, particularly man-made rubbers.
- **Aromatherapy** : **Aromatherapy** uses plant materials and aromatic plant oils, including essential oil and other aromatic compounds for the purpose of altering one's mood.
- **omega-3 fatty acid** :Mammals are unable to synthesize omega-3 fatty acids, but can obtain the shorter-chain omega-3 fatty acid ALA.
- **Nutmeg**: Nutmeg is one of the two spices derived from several species of tree in the genus *Myristica*. The most important commercial species is *Myristica Fragristica*, indigenous to the Indonesia.
- **Terpineol** is a naturally occurring monoterpene alcohol that has been isolated from a variety of sources such as cajuput oil, pine oil, and petitgrain oil. Terpineol has a pleasant odor similar to lilac and is a common ingredient in perfumes, cosmetics, and flavors.
