Glossary

lycopene: Lycopene from the <u>neo-Latin</u> *lycopersicum*, the tomato species, is a red carotene and carotenoid pigment bright andphytochemical found in tomatoes and other red fruits and vegetables, such red carrots, watermelons, gac, although and papayas, not in strawberries, or cherries

carcinogenic: A carcinogen is any substance, <u>radionuclide</u>, or <u>radiation</u> that is an agent directly involved in causing <u>cancer</u>. This may be due to the ability to damage the <u>genome</u> or to the disruption of cellular <u>metabolic</u> processes.

folate: Folic acid, also known as folate, is one of the <u>B vitamins</u>

prostate cancer: Prostate cancer, also known as carcinoma of the prostate, is the development of <u>cancer</u> in the <u>prostate</u>, a gland in the <u>male reproductive</u> <u>system</u>
