Glossary

1. Staffing

Staffing refers to the number of workers employed to work in a particular organization or building.

2. Gradual

Gradual refer to taking place in stages over an extended period; not steep or abrupt.

3. Retrogressive

4. Vacuum

5. **Equipment**

6. Mortality Table

8. **Survivors**

A person who survives; a person remaining alive after an event in which others have died; the remainder of a group of people or things.

9. Circumstances

An event or fact that causes or helps to cause something to happen, typically something undesirable.

10. Hostesses

A woman who receives or entertains guests in a social or official capacity; a woman who manages hotel.

11. Recruited

To supply with new men, as an army; to fill up or make up by enlistment.

12. Policy

Policy is a proposed or adopted course or principle of action; a contract of insurance.

13. Salvage Value

The estimated value that an asset will realize upon its sale at the end of its useful life.

14. Resale Value

If the holder of the good wishes to resell the good to another party, this would be the amount of money that could be expected to be made from the transaction.

15. **Progressive**

Progressive refers to proceeding gradually or in stages; increasing as a proportion of the sum.
