Glossary

1. Demography

The study of the structure of human populations using statistics relating to births, wealth, disease. etc.

2. Survey

Examine and record the area & features of say land, area, community. etc

3. Infant

A very young child or baby.

4. Mortality

Death, especially on a large scale; the number of deaths in a given area or period.

5. **Fertility**

Able to conceive young or produce seed; ability to give birth.

6. Retrospective

Looking back on or dealing with past events or situation; development of an artist's work over a period of time.

8. Precision

The quality, conditions or facts of being precise; marked by or designed for accuracy and exactness.

9. Cartographic

The science or practice of drawing maps.

10. Longitudinal

It means running lengthwise; involved information about an individual or group gathered over a prolonged period.

11. Census

An official count or survey of a population.

12. Dissemination

It means to spread widely.

13. Nuptiality

The frequency or incidence of marriage within a population.

It is related to newborn baby or mammal.
