Glossary

1. Natality:

Natality in population ecology is the scientific term for birth rate; it is used to calculate the dynamics of a population. They are the key factors in determining whether a population is increasing, decreasing or staying the same in size.

2. Survivorship curve

A survivorship curve is a graph showing the number or proportion of individuals surviving at each age for a given species or group.

3. De facto

De facto is a Latin expression that means "concerning fact." In law, it often means "in practice but not necessarily ordained by law" or "in practice or actuality, but not officially established."

4. Abridgement

Abridgement is a term defined as "shortening" or "condensing" and is most commonly used in reference to the act of reducing a written work, typically a book, into a shorter form.

5. Cohort

In statistics and demography, a cohort is a group of subjects who have shared a particular event together during a particular time span.

6. Emigration

Emigration is the act of permanently leaving one's country or region to settle in another. It is the same as immigration but from the perspective of the country of origin.

7. Immigration

Immigration is people or animals moving and settling in a country or region to which they are not native.

8. Life expectancy

Life expectancy is the expected (in the statistical sense) number of years of life remaining at a given age.

9. Cumulatively

In statistics it means Increasing or enlarging by successive addition.

10. Pivotal column

The "pivot columns" are the columns that contain the leading 1's of the rows.

11. Age structure

The age structure is defined as the relative number of individuals of each age in a population.

12. Bio meter' of the population

An instrument for measuring the amount of population from raw data.

13. Actuarial science

Actuarial science is the discipline that applies mathematical and statistical methods to assess say risk in the various industries.

14. Mortality
