1. Acreage

Area of land measured in acres.

2. Anthropology

The scientific study of the origin, the behaviour, and the physical, social, and cultural development of humans.

3. Bale

A large package of raw or finished material tightly bound with twine or wire and often wrapped.

4. Clause

A group of words containing a subject and a predicate and forming part of a compound or complex sentence.

5. Committee

A group of people officially delegated to perform a function, such as investigating, considering, reporting, or acting on a matter.

6. Expenditure

The act or process of expending.

7. Famine

A severe shortage of food, as through crop failure or overpopulation.

8. Honor

A program of advanced study for exceptional students.

9. Intellectual

A person who enjoys mental activity and has highly developed tastes in art, literature, etc.

10. Indebtedness

Something owed to another.

11. Meteorology

The science that deals with the phenomena of the atmosphere, especially weather and weather conditions.

12. Recruit

To supply with new members or employees.

13. Regression

The relationship between the mean value of a random variable and the corresponding values of one or more independent variables.

14. Reform

To improve by alteration, correction of error, or removal of defects.

15. **Sample Survey** A sample survey is a study that obtains data from a subset of a population, in order to estimate population attributes.
